"Every Idle Word: How We Speak" (con't)

- Matt 12:36 every careless/idol word is what we will be judged on
 - v34 our words come from the heart; we restrain our actions but not our words sometimes
 - Words we haven't put any thought into are careless
 - What is the purpose of the words you're using?
- What words are not idol?
 - Not just "plain and forward"
 - It doesn't always have to be clear, plain, forward
 - If we want people to think, we can be vague
 - Matt 16:5ff Jesus is vague in order to teach
 - Acts 10 Peter's vision of the animals in the blanket: vague
 - Not careless, but in fact more thought probably went into them
 - Not just being literal
 - We determine literality based on context and cross-reference
 - 1 Peter 3:3 not a literal statement about not wearing clothes
 - If we insist everything must be literal, we will find may contradictions
 - Prov 26:4f how can these verses be literal? (cf. with not just "plain and forward" statements)
 - Luke 14:26 do we literally "hate" our family?
 - Humor can fall into this category
 - Matt 15:26 Jesus being playful about the Jew/Gentile relationship
 - Matt 23:24 Jesus paints a funny picture
 - Titus 1:12 Cretans talk against themselves
 - Sarcasm can fall into this category

- Amos 4:4 God says to go to Bethel and sin
- Not just subjective
 - Think about what people will think if we say something a certain way
 - We shouldn't assume the worst from people
 - We can't let our interpretation be the standard when others might meant something else or said something a certain way
 - The standard of judgment from God comes from the heart, not always from the words we used
